Dear Adam:

Yesterday, our client had an appointment at our office at 4:45 p.m. As you know, my office is only one-half a mile away from the location where the IME of Jane Doe 6 took place. At or around that time, Mr. Epstein was leaving the building where the IME was taking place. It appears that at the time Jeffrey Epstein was exiting the building, your client and your associate were outside smoking a cigarette. Mr. Epstein entered his vehicle and left the building where his office is located and made his way to my office without speaking or acknowledging either person.

I learned from Dr. Hall that your client, by and through her lawyer, prematurely terminated the IME. This was not proper. With regard to past agreements, you were obligated to call when you and your client arrived at the building and to call when you and your client were leaving the building. Your associate did not follow that procedure at the IME. Instead, your client and your associate took several smoking breaks without letting anyone know that they had exited the building. This procedure was initiated by and used at your request.

Mr. Epstein was leaving the building to attend a meeting with his lawyers. There was no way, without a phone call from your office, that Mr. Epstein could know that your clients were outside smoking cigarettes.
